



WELCOME TO GUADALAJARA

Mexico's second most important city, founded in 1542, the "Pearl of the West" is a captivating metropolis, full of contrast and tradition. Much of the emblematic folklore for which our country is known around the world comes from Guadalajara and its state, Jalisco. Guadalajara is an engaging city and an undisputed symbol of Mexico that offers world-class amenities without losing its provincial charm.





The Guadalajara Metropolitan Area is home to four and a half million inhabitants, and includes the municipalities of Guadalajara, Zapopan, Tonalá and Tlaquepaque, where the ITESO campus is located.



Known for its mariachis, monuments and soccer teams, Guadalajara has many other facets as well: it is an important business hub and a center of technological development that has attracted a significant number of electronics companies, as well as hardware and software developers. Its vibrant cultural life includes outdoor concerts and other artistic activities, as well as internationally relevant events such as the International Book Fair —the most important in Latin America and one of the most important in the Spanish-speaking world— as well as the Guadalajara International Film Festival. In 2005, our city was named the Cultural Capital of the Americas. In 2011, the city of Guadalajara hosted the Pan American Games.

Guadalajara reshapes itself day by day. Countless ITESO professors and alumni have made significant contributions to what Guadalajara is today, and have put it on the world map in the arts, the sciences and advanced social thought.

ITESO, the Jesuit University of Guadalajara, was founded in 1957 and has come to be known for academic excellence, community service, an intelligent spirit and international vision with both global and local perspectives. It belongs to a group of over 200 Jesuit universities around the world, sharing with them a 500 year-old educational tradition, known historically for educating leaders in every field of science and the arts. In Mexico, ITESO belongs to the Jesuit University System, a collaborative project with other high-level academic institutions, including the five campuses of the Universidad Iberoamericana (Mexico City, León, Puebla, Tijuana and Torreón), the Universidad Loyola del Pacífico and the Instituto Superior Intercultural Ayuuk Oaxaca-Mixe.

ITESO grew out of the dream of a group of Jesuits, families and local business people who, some 60 years ago, laid the material and ideological foundations for a different kind of university in Guadalajara. The proposal has been to combine the professional formation and preparation of men and women with a deep sense of social responsibility and justice. ITESO programs are built around the philosophy of Jesuit education, which is known around the world for the comprehensive formation of leaders in every field of science and the arts. ITESO's social commitment is focused on our country's and the world's most urgent development needs: human rights, poverty, education, social and environmental sustainability, urban development, technology, the rural sector and industry.

ITESO has high academic standards, which have been recognized by different accreditation bodies that evaluate our undergraduate and graduate programs. As a University that belongs to the Society of Jesus, ITESO seeks academic excellence in teaching, research, and socially pertinent collaboration, with the aim of training the professionals that our society needs to create a more humane and cohesive world.



THE **GREEN** CAMPUS

ITESO has over 12,000 students and more than 30,000 alumni; a 49-hectare campus that combines nature, architecture and technology in an environment that encourages thinking, the expression of emotions, the cultivation of the spirit, and the promotion of athletic and cultural activities. The university community and its visitors have access to the latest educational facilities and equipment, a network of state-of-the-art informatics and technological systems, fully-equipped laboratories for different disciplines, athletic and recreational spaces, and common areas that leave room for nature.



ITESO is the first university in Jalisco to receive the Certification of Voluntary Compliance with Environmental Standards, awarded by the Ministry of the Environment and Territorial Development (SEMA-DET, in its initials in Spanish) of the Jalisco State Government. This certification is awarded to institutions that take voluntary actions leading to good environmental practices in all of their processes.

FACILITIES

44 buildings distributed harmoniously over 49 hectares of green areas, with close to 3,700 trees of 300 different species, as well as facilities designed for users with special needs.



- More than 90 specialized laboratories and 74 undergraduate workshops.
- Eight auditoriums with capacity for up to 2,500 people.
- Athletic facilities: football, rugby and baseball fields; tennis, basketball, volleyball and beach volleyball courts; gymnasium; track-and-field facilities including a long-jump pit, and recreational areas.

ITESO has 27 hectares in the nature reserve, located in the core recovery areas of La Primavera Forest, devoted to promoting environmental education, sustainable and comprehensive management, and the conservation and protection of nature.

CENTER FOR **TECHNOLOGY**AND **INNOVATION** MANAGEMENT

(CEGINT, IN ITS INITIALS IN SPANISH)

The mission of this center is the research, design and development of projects that link the university community to businesses, entrepreneurs, business associations, and the government.

It is located within the ITESO Technology Park, a specialized working space that contributes to regional development by nurturing entrepreneurship and innovation. Here, students join the research teams of incubated businesses, or undertake their own business project.

High-Tech Business Incubator: Receive specialized guidance to start up your own business with support from ITESO, or get help in finding sources of financing to take an existing project to the next level. The main sectors that we work with include hardware, software, electronics, agro-technology, the recycling industry, biotechnology, and food processing.

UNIVERSITY **BUSINESS CENTER**

A platform where students participate in the sustainable development of companies, helping them to generate more and better jobs, distribute wealth fairly, and contribute to the economic and social development of the region. Its business development programs help students develop skills, values and work experience.

Micro- and Small-Business Development

This program lets students experience the reality of small businesses, a strategic sector for regional development, as they work on multidisciplinary teams under the guidance of expert consultants, learning how to identify a company's problems, propose solutions for improvement, and optimize the communication and relationships between business owners and the rest of the people who participate the company.

Professional Internships and Employment:

Through consulting and information about the job market, students connect with companies for job opportunities or professional practices in a wide range of organizations, from small businesses to transnational corporations, including private, public, and non-profit organizations.

Formation of Entrepreneurs and Business Incubation

The Young University Entrepreneur Program (Jovem, in its initials in Spanish) helps students to develop their entrepreneurial spirit and become successful business people. It shows them how to turn an idea into a business plan, and then to formalize and consolidate their company through the business incubator. It also guides them through the process of securing the funds they need to strengthen their business.

PROFESSIONAL APPLICATION PROJECTS

ITESO undergraduate programs include Professional Application Projects (PAP), an educational mediation for students' social and professional formation.

PAP consist of a series of activities carried out in a real-world setting, where students apply their professional knowledge and skills and take an active role in proposing and implementing plans and strategies that generate viable solutions to real social problems. These projects combine students' Social Service with their undergraduate capstone project.

Among the main sources of experience and knowledge for students are social projects, organized by ITESO's Center for Social Research and Formation. The university is involved in the following projects, among others:

The Indigenous Interculturalism Program

promotes education, the defense of territory, care for the environment, and the improvement of productive systems that are respectful of the cultural forms of indigenous communities.

The Alternative Regional Development Program has operated in southern Jalisco for over 25 years based on four main lines of collective action: solidarity economics, sustainable environmental management, civic-political action and popular education.

The Empowerment and Social Conflict Program contributes to knowledge, education and intervention in sociopolitical conflicts that arise between citizens' movements and the government.

The Political Ecology Program establishes ties with social actors in places of environmental conflict to build alternatives for social transformation related to water resources, agro-diversity, and public and social management.

The Institutional Program of Human Rights and Peace raises awareness in the university community regarding human rights and peace by promoting the public discussion of relevant issues, with an aim to reshaping the sociopolitical dynamics of Jalisco.

ITESO has the largest private library in the region, and one of the most important in the country in Social Sciences and Humanities.

It includes five special book collections and one made up of rare and ancient books, along with audiovisual, blueprint, map, and printed periodical collections, as well as a digital library for online consulting.

- Over 500,000 documents including textbooks, monographs, literary works, dissertations, encyclopedias, dictionaries, maps, and audiovisual material. Over 300,000 printed books.
- Audiovisual collection with over 14,000 copies in different formats. Periodicals section with over 130,000 copies of journals.
- Collection of local, national and foreign newspapers. Approximately 2,000 geographical maps.
- Rare and ancient book collection with over 9,000 documents, including specialized material.
- Statistical and geographical information from the National Institute of Statistics, Geography and Informatics (INE-GI, in its initials in Spanish).
- Digital library with two million electronic documents ranging from articles in academic journals to financial reports, statistical information, journalism, and maps; the archive includes 28,175 full-text articles from electronic journals, 171,553 books in digital format, and 65 databases.
- Rooms for projecting audiovisuals, courses and consulting.
- Room for users with special needs.
- 18 cubicles for teamwork.
- Book and document loan renewals available online.
- Professional library assistance and user training program.
- Cafeteria and reading rooms.



The campus has the following facilities and services:

- Multi-purpose field house, with two basketball/volleyball courts that can be used simultaneously.
- Physical Activity and Recreation Center, with cardio equipment, a weight room, spinning facilities, a recreational area and a cafeteria.
- ■400-meter running track and long-jump pit.
- 2,500-meter pedestrian circuit.
- Two outdoor basketball/volleyball courts and a beach volleyball court.
- Three tennis courts.
- Four soccer fields.
- Multi-purpose field (baseball, rugby and soccer).
- Sports medicine facility equipped with a physical the rapy and rehabilitation room and a sports science laboratory.
- Changing rooms equipped with showers, bathrooms and lockers.
- Terrace with tables, chairs and umbrellas for recreational use.
- Athletic equipment on loan.

SPORTS AND WELLNESS

Comprehensive education is a priority at ITESO, which is why it offers students the possibility to practice different sports, such as track and field, cheerleading, basketball, soccer, rugby, tae kwon do, tennis, volleyball, and beach volleyball.

All ITESO athletic activities are supported by specialists in physical conditioning, high-performance training, nutrition, sports medicine and psychology, games, recreation and leisure.




CASA ITESO CLAVIGERO




INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

The internationalization of education is an essential priority at ITESO. Undergraduate and graduate students can do some of their studies abroad and choose from over 100 universities— Jesuit and non-Jesuit— in different countries on five continents, thanks to collaboration agreements between ITESO and other universities and exchange programs.

In addition to the academic exchange program, the university offers a range of other options, such as summer courses abroad, the ITESO international summer program, as well as double-degree programs with renowned business schools in France. Furthermore, ITESO supports the international development of its academics by offering them guidance and information about professional stays, academic programs and scholarships for studying abroad.

International Summer Program

The International Summer Program at ITESO gives students the opportunity to experience international and multicultural diversity through courses taught by distinguished academics from around the world.



Double-degree program in France

ITESO has set up collaboration agreements in France for double-degree programs in the area of business at the graduate level with ESC RENNES, School of Business, and with ESSCA, École Supérieure des Sciences Commerciales d'Angers, a university with campuses in different cities in France and Eastern Europe.

Three-Plus-One Program

This innovative program is an option for students who wish to study in Mexico but are not yet proficient enough in Spanish. They are given the opportunity to make progress in their undergraduate studies while they study Spanish. The program includes I-3 courses in English, related to the areas of business, humanities, and social sciences, as well as classes in basic and intermediate Spanish.

Along with the courses, students can undertake professional internships in many types of companies, as well as professional application projects, which include social intervention and community initiatives.

Language Department

ITESO offers English certification programs, as well as courses to learn German, French, Italian and Spanish as a second language. The campus has a multimedia laboratory that is equipped with technology and teaching materials for students to learn and practice languages on their own.

International PhD in Social Welfare, in collaboration with Boston College.


This program meets the need for training high-level professionals in the study, research, and application of social welfare and related topics.





FORMAL RESEARCH PROGRAMS

Research at ITESO is carried out within the framework of formal research projects that respond to social needs related to the objects of study of the different academic departments:

Electronics, Systems and Informatics

Research focuses on technological development that is relevant to the regional economy in the field of electronics and information technology.

Sociocultural Studies

Research focuses on studying the sociocultural production of meaning. Questions about the production of meaning open up a wide range of relevant issues that can be examined from an interdisciplinary and sociocultural perspective.

Sociopolitical and Legal Studies

Research focuses on generating new knowledge concerning five issues that relate to the quality of democracy.

Habitat and Urban Development

Research focuses on producing new, useful, and relevant knowledge related to the processes of producing human habitat.

Technological and Industrial Processes

Its general objective is to develop theoretical and practical knowledge that serves to examine and solve problems related to the use of natural resources and the way processes impact the environment and communities, particularly in western Mexico.

Education

Its general objective is to study socio-educational practices in order to influence them so that they come closer to fulfilling their main purpose: improving people's quality of life.

Psychology, Health and Community

Research focuses on producing knowledge about the interrelationships among psychological and sociocultural factors and processes that generate wellness or illness in individuals, groups or institutions, and promoting projects that have a positive impact on these issues.



Economics, Management and Marketing

Research focuses on the following issues:



ITESO belongs to the Mexican Association of Higher Education Institutions of Christian Inspiration (AMIESIC, in its initials in Spanish), the National Association of Institutions of Higher Education and Universities (ANUIES), and the Federation of Mexican Private Academic Institutions (FIMPES).
